DUNDEE NATURALISTS' SOCIETY

Outing to Camperdown Park, Dundee 14/10/1978.

Higher fungi recorded on and around the Nature Trail running to the north and west of Comperdown House in Camperdown Park.

Cup' Fungi (Ascomycetes)

Pezizales

Peziza badia-sessile brownish cup shape with a wavy margin.

Helotiales

Coryne sarcoides - reddish purple small gelatinous cup shapes on dead wood

Sphaeriales

Xylaria hypoxylon tough black tark-like structures; tips often powdered white Hypoxylon fragiforme – small blackish rounded structures on bark of dead branches Diatrypedisaformis – small blackish angular discs on bark of dead branches

Hypocreales

Nectria cinnabarina - 'Coral Spot' - fairly soft small pink spots on bark of dead branches and

Rhytisma acerinum - 'Tar Spot' - black tar spots on Sycamore leaves

'Club' Fungi (Basidiomycetes)

The lephoracece (of Aphyllophorales)

Stereum rugosum - flattened brownish structures on hardwoods; bruising blood red Tholephora terrestris - clustered brown fibrillose fon-like structures

Clavariaceae

Clavaria rugosa - fairly soft small white 'antier-like' structures on the ground

Polyporaceae

Poria vaillantii – flat whitish structures on dead wood; sometimes cottony
Trametes serialis – flattened whitish or greyish structures on coniferous wood
Crifola giantea – large fairly soft brown fan shaped bracket fungi on hord woodstumps

Agaricaceae (of Agaricales)

Incholoma virgatum - ash-grey cap; tough fibrous stalk

T. sævum - 'Bleuits' - cap and gills pale clay colour. Stalk flushed bluish Aronillaria mellea - 'Honey Fungus' - yellow brown cap; membranous ring; on wood

Laccaria amethystina - violet when moist, pale when dry; large well separated gills
L. laccata - pale yellow brown esp. when dry; gills large and well apart

Collybio peranata - 'Wood Wolly-foot' - yellowish brown cap; stalk base wooly-hairy

Oudemansiella mucida - white very rounded cap and very slimy

O. radicota - yellow brown slimy cop; hard stalk with taproot Mycena flavo-alba - small white rounded cop with thin white stalk

Amonita muscaeria - striking scarlet or orange red cap with white warts ring on stalk.

A. vaginata - ash grey flattened cap with indented margins, no ring on stalk

A. rubescens - dull reddish brown cop with off white patches, damaged flesh reddening

Coprinus micaceus - thingbrown conical cop, deeply greaved towards the edge.

Hypholoma sublateritium - red brown cap; gills yellow to brownish; tuited on hard wood stump

H. capnoides - bright yellow cap; gills pale yallow to brown; tufted on conifer wood.

Pholista squarrosa - cap and stalk straw coloured, voered with brown scales; base of hard wood trees

Paxillus involutus - live brown cap, young edge inrolled; gills bruising brown

Boletus gramulatus - cap brownish yellow and slimy; top of stalk granular in appearance Russula achroleuca - yellowish cap, gills and stipe white; no smell

R. atropurpurea - cop purplish red, more or less blackish at the centre

R. mairei - scarlet cap, often with white patches, faint honey smell; only in beech woods Lactorius fuliginosus - dark brown cap, dry and shortly velvety; danaged flesh turning pinkish

L. turpis - cap dive brown with a usually inrolled margin, stout tapering stalk

Gasteromycetales

Lycoperdon pynforme – a 'Puff Ball' – surface coarsely mealy; only species growing on woor' Tremellales

*Calocera viscosa – bright orange yellow and like a tiny stag's horn; slimy; on conifer stumps
Dacrymyces deliquescens – orange-yellow jelly-like masses on rotting wood

Furthermore, because of the poor state of many of the specimens, there were several that could not be recognised with certainty and have been tentatively identified only:

Clitocybe fragrans
Rhodophyllus aprile
Cortinarius sp.
Some 3 or 4 more species were not identified with any certainty at all

A slime mould (Myxomycete) species was also found: Lycogala epidendron - small soft rounded structures; pink at first, turning brown
