Cup (or 'Sac') Fungi and allies (Ascomycetes)

Nectria cinnabarina - Coral Spot (small hard pink lumps on bark of dead branches)
Cap (or 'Club') Fungi and allies (Pasidiomycetes)

Thelephora terrestris - (dark brown, ran-shaped, on the ground)

Clavaria spp - Fairy Clubs (yellowish club-like structures, on ground)

Coltrichia persnnis - (thin brown funnel on ground; with pores undermeath)

Trameter serialis - (pale brown structure lying flat on wood)

Polyporus versicolor -(with pores underneath)

Gill Fungi (Agarics)

Hygrophorus hypothejus - (triangular
section gills; 'cheesy' stalk;
olive-brown slimy cap)

H. coccineus - (bright scarlet bell-shaped cap)

H. conicus - (orange to scarlet acutely conical cap)

Tricholoma flavovirens - (white spores, adnate gills, tough stipe; yellowish, browns with age)

T. imbricatum - (mousey-brown, coarse overlapping scales on cap).

T. (Lepista) nudum - Wood Blewits (more or less wholly lilac)

T. (Lepista) - Blewits (cap
pale brown with pale bluish stalk)

Tricholomopsis rutilens - (cap with pale

Tricholomopsis rutilans - (cap with pale purplish-red scales on yellow back-ground; gills chrome-yellow)

Clitocybe nebularis - (fleshy pale grey cap with tapering stalk)

clevipes - (deeply decurrent gills; marked unbo; club-like base)

C. flaccida - (deeply decurrent gills; leathery brown-spotted cap)
Laccaria amethystina - (videly spaced

Collybia maculata - (tough whitish cap and stalk; soon brown spotted)

Amanita muscaria - Fly Agaric (bulb at base; ring on stalk; scarlet to orange-red cap with whitish warts)

A. fulva - Tawny Grisette (date brown cap; no ring on stalk)

A. rubescens - The Blusher (cap dull brown; damaged flesh reddening)

Agaricus arvensis - Horse Mush.coom (cap whitish with greyish gills)

Hypholoma fasciculare - Sulphur Tuît (cap and stalk ochre-yellow; tufted)

Pholiota flammans - (tawny yellow scaly ca)

Hygrophoropsis aurantiaca - False Chanterelle (orange-yellow, cup-shaped)

Paxillus involutus - (olive-brown, incurvous edge to cap when young)

Boletus luteus - Slippery Jack (pores; slimy brownish esp; ring on stalk)

B. bovinus - (buff cap; no ring)

B. chrysenteron - (olive-brown cap; often cracking to show reddish flu

B. edulis - Penny Bun (cap brownish; swollen stalk with network of fine raised veins at top)

Russula ochroleuca - (ochre-yellow cap)

R. emetica - The Sickener (pure scarlet cap; under conifers)

R. mairei - very similar to above sp. but found under beech trees)

R. queletii - wine-red to purplishviolet cap; under conifers; like
all the other Russula spp. gills
are long and tightly packed and
the stalk is brittle, easily
breaking transversely.

Lactarius rufus - (white milk, dull reddish-brown cap)

- L. subdulcis (like above sp. but found under beech trees)
- L. deliciosus (cap orange-red and faintly zoned; milk rapidly turning bright ornage, green when cooked; under conifers).
- Lycoperdon caelatum Puff-ball (pear shaped whitish-grey and cracked)
- L. molle (slightly spiny but these soon fall off)
- L. pyriforme Stump Puff-ball (fruit coarsely mealy; clustered)
- Dacrymyces deliquescens -(gelatinous orange-yellow bodies on wood)
